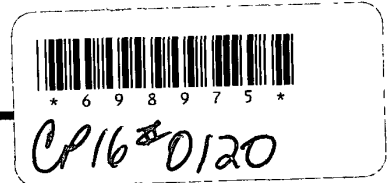

Dear Commissioners,

I've been reading attorney, Glenn Amster's court brief in the appeal of the GMHB 1995 decision, along with the other briefs. In one of the items is information regarding the original 1993 resource lands task force, who were charged with deciding forest and agriculture designations. The agriculture task force was unable to come to consensus whether the county had commercially viable agriculture. They submitted two reports, one saying there was none, and the other saying there was and it needed protection. One of those members who said to protect it was Blair Wolfley. Mr. Wolfley now works for the county, part time as the Heritage Farm manager. And, he also is a primary party in the BERK consulting firm. The language I read in that report in 1993 is the same language I read in the county presentations and the BERK Rural Lands Report. As far as I can see, nothing has changed from 1993-1994 to today. What they wanted then, they got, even when the agri-forest was re-done. They got 5, 10 and 20 acre rural zones, 20, 160 acre ag zones, and 40, 80 acre forest zones. And it is clear that staff wants to keep them.
