



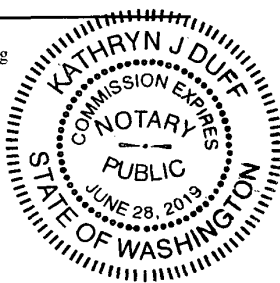

that the Clark County Planning
Commission will conduct a
public hearing on THURSDAY,
September 17, 2015 at 6:30
p.m., at the Clark County
Public Service Center, 1300
Franklin, Vancouver, WA, to
consider the following:
2016 COMPREHENSIVE
PLAN UPDATE SUPPLEMEN-
TAL ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT
STATEMENT PREFERRED
ALTERNATIVE

Clark County is updating its
comprehensive plan to meet
the 2016 Growth Management
Act deadline. As part of the
update process, the county is
required to analyze growth
alternatives through the SEPA
process. The county has re-
adopted the environmental im-
pact statement (EIS) prepared
on the 2007 update and
prepared a supplemental EIS
(SEIS) to look at potential
growth alternatives for the
2016-2035 time horizon. Four
alternatives are reviewed in the
draft SEIS.

The Board of County Coun-
cillors and the Planning Com-
mission are hearing public
testimony at a joint public
hearing on September 3 and
10, 2015. The purpose of the
hearing on September 17 is for
the Planning Commission to
deliberate and make a recom-
mendation to the Board on a
preferred alternative. The
Board will ultimately decide on
a preferred alternative, and a
final SEIS will be prepared on
the preferred alternative.
