Thank you for contacting Community Planning regarding Engage Clark County's topics. You are correct, the deadline to use Engage Clark County to make comments was May 11. The survey should have stated closed and we have made that fix, so thank you for letting us know.

I also wanted to let you know that citizens can still submit comments for the joint Planning Commission and board hearing by email, the online comment form or mail until 5 p.m. on May 24. Residents also can provide oral testimony at the May 19 and May 24 hearings. Although comments can be submitted right up to the last hearing date, it is helpful for decision makers to receive comments as early as possible.

Following the joint Planning Commission and board hearings on May 19 and May 24, the Planning Commission is scheduled to deliberate and develop a recommendation to the board on June 2. They will consider all submitted materials, including written and oral testimony. After the Planning Commission has made its recommendation to the board, another comment period will begin. The board has scheduled a June 21 public hearing to take testimony on the Planning Commission's recommendation.
