Chapter 11 - Community Design Element of the 2016 Comprehensive Plan only consists of 4 pages, but the impact to the community is profound. The Chapter contains this language:

In 2012, two new plans (Growing Healthier Report and Aging Readiness Plan) were created by and with the community to assure we are developing and sustaining healthy and age friendly communities. Something as simple as a sidewalk can improve your health and the health of your neighbors by encouraging walking for recreation or travel, Research shows that there are key features of communities that influence helath, such as parks, safe streets, public gathering places, and easy access to healthy food. The Growing Healthier Report and the Aging Readiness Plan have contributed policies related to community design.

Clark County Citizens United, Inc. rejects this Chapter 11 proposal and insists that it be removed from the Comprehensive Plan. The public is not aware of the information in this Chapter and was not aware of when and where it was adopted as a "plan". All of the items seem harmless enough and certainly we can agree that they are not bad things to do.
