



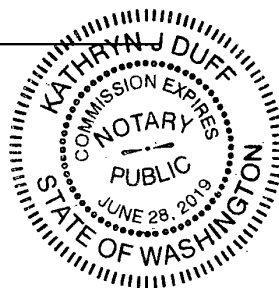

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the following proposal has been determined to have no probable significant adverse impact on the environment, and that an environmental impact statement is not required under RCW 43.21C.030(2)(c). Written comments on the following proposal, or DNS, may be submitted to the Responsible Official by August 13, 2015.

DESCRIPTION:

CPZ2015-00001 Clark County Parks, Recreation, and Open Space Plan--

The Clark County Parks, Recreation, and Open Space Plan (PROS) represents the guiding document for the Greater Clark Parks Department regarding provision of parks, recreational facilities, open space, and trails. Per the State of Washington Growth Management Act (GMA) 36.70A requirements, this

parks master plan contains the following elements: designation of the general location and extent of land uses including recreation and open space lands; identification of useful lands for recreation, including wildlife habitat, trails, and connection of critical areas; estimation of park and recreation demand for at least a 10-year period; and both a six-year and 20-year capital facilities plan.

ACTION REQUESTED: It is requested the Board of County Commissioners adopt the Clark County Parks, Recreation, and Open Space Plan.
