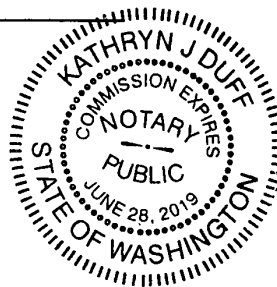

that the Board of Clark County  
Councilors will conduct a pub-  
lic hearing on TUESDAY,  
October 20, 2015, at 10:00  
a.m., at the Clark County  
Public Service Center, 1300  
Franklin, Vancouver, WA, to  
consider the following:

**RECOMMENDATION  
FROM THE CLARK COUNTY  
PLANNING COMMISSION ON  
A PREFERRED ALTERNA-  
TIVE FOR THE 2016 COM-  
PREHENSIVE PLAN UPDATE**

Clark County is updating its  
comprehensive plan to meet  
the 2016 Growth Management  
Act deadline. As part of the  
update process, the county is  
required to analyze the im-  
pacts of growth alternatives  
through the SEPA process.  
The county re-adopted the  
environmental impact state-  
ment (EIS) prepared for the  
2007 update and prepared a  
draft supplemental EIS  
(DSEIS) to analyze four (4)  
potential growth options for the  
2016-2035 time horizon. The  
Board and the Planning Com-  
mission held a joint public  
hearing on the DSEIS on  
September 3 and 10. On  
September 17, the Planning  
Commission decided on its  
preferred alternative to recom-  
mend to the Board.

The purpose of the hearing  
is to take public testimony on  
the Planning Commission rec-  
ommendation for a preferred  
alternative. The Board will  
select a preferred alternative,  
and a final SEIS will be  
prepared on that alternative.
