Thank you for your email and inquiry. Good questions. At this time we have not been directed to work on another alternative. You asked both planning and legal questions. If another alternative is introduced and it falls within the four options analyzed in the DSEIS then there will be no need for additional SEPA review. If on the other hand a new land use plan that is outside what was studied in the DSEIS, it will require a public participation, input from local jurisdictions, and interested parties.

The BOCC hearing scheduled for October 20, 2015 is advertised as a consideration of the PC recommendations. The Board may adopt, reject, or modify the "preferred alternative" recommended by the PC. I hope this is helpful. Thank you.
