

**NOTICE OF  
PUBLIC MEETINGS**

Clark County, Washington is updating its comprehensive plan to meet the 2016 Growth Management Act deadline. As part of the update process, the county is required to analyze the impacts of growth alternatives through the SEPA process. The county re-adopted the environmental impact statement (EIS) prepared for the 2007 update and prepared a draft supplemental EIS (DSEIS) to analyze four (4) potential growth options for the 2016-2035 time horizon. The Board and the Planning Commission held a joint public hearing on the DSEIS on September 3 and 10. On September 17, the Planning Commission decided on a preferred alternative to recommend to the Board. On October 20, the Board held a hearing on the Planning Commission recommendation.

The BOCC will hold a public hearing on November 24. The purpose of that hearing is for the Board to continue to take public testimony on the Planning Commission recommendation for a preferred alternative (continued from October 20, 2015), and for the Board to discuss other changes to planning assumptions and/or alternatives presented in the EIS process. The Board will select a preferred alternative, and a final SEIS will be prepared on that alternative.

Information to be presented at the November 24 hearing will be available at two public meetings:

- Both meetings are from 5:30-7:00 p.m.

Following the public meetings, the county will hold a Planning Commission Hearing:

- November 19, Public Services Center, 1300 Franklin St., Vancouver at 6:30 p.m.

The Board of Clark County Councilor Hearing will be:

- November 24, Public Services Center, 1300 Franklin St., Vancouver at 10:00 a.m.
