

# County Council changes growth plan alternative

The Clark County Council approved sweeping changes to the preferred alternative to the county's comprehensive growth management plan update Tuesday afternoon.

The action took place during a continuation of last week's hearing to reconsider the preferred alternative passed in late 2015 which was based largely on a revised Alternative 4 proposal authored by Councilor David Madore.

In a 3-2 vote, councilors repealed the previous preferred alternative and set about tailoring a new preferred alternative from proposals already studied in the draft supplemental environmental impact statement and voted on by the Clark County Planning Commission.

Over several hours, councilors went through a list of individual provisions and voted on whether or not to include them in the new preferred alternative. Parts of Alternative 1, 2, and 3 were included in the new preferred alternative. Councilors voted not to include any provision from Alternative 4 with Councilors Jeanne Stewart and Julie Olsen voting and Council Chair Boldt voting to omit, and Councilors David Madore and Tom Mielke dissenting
