Very little can be said due to the confidentiality needed to investigate the truth of the reports by individuals regarding the Comp Plan beginning on January 13 and on February 16 and 23.

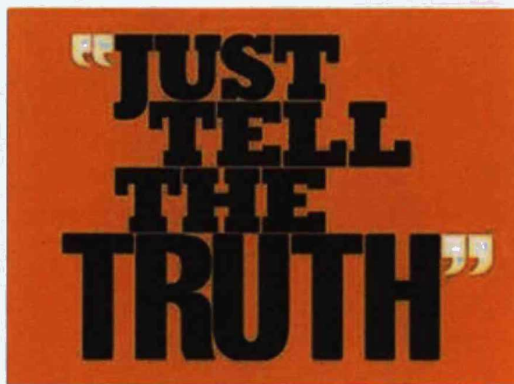

Follow the truth wherever it leads. Numbers and facts are not subject to opinion. No policy or decision is valid if it requires misrepresentation for its justification.

Sunshine is a great disinfectant. Clark County never used to record Board Time meetings or work sessions. But since full transparency became top priority and standard procedure in early 2013, those records are very valuable to reveal exactly what transpired in each meeting.
