Clark County, Washington is updating its Comprehensive Growth Management Plan, to be completed by June 30, 2016. The county has prepared a final supplemental environmental impact statement (FSEIS) in compliance with the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA). The FSEIS will be issued on April 27, 2016. The FSEIS will inform the public of the potential environmental impacts of the preferred alternative along with possible mitigation measures. Issuance of the FSEIS completes the required SEPA process.

Agencies, affected tribes, and members of the public are invited to comment on the FSEIS in conjunction with public hearings on the comprehensive plan update.
